

THE TRUTH: Long before the Minnesota controversy, Molly Jenkins opposed legislation that would have created a new felony offense for distributing flyers and religious tracts outside a church.



SHADY LEMONS

An **anonymous dark-money group**, which isn't found on file with the State Ethics Commission, has no address, and no phone number, is accusing Molly Jenkins of siding with Don Lemon. What they aren't telling you is the full story behind the "**Lemon Law**."

The vote, SB 743, occurred last year — long before Don Lemon's stunt in Minnesota; and, Oklahoma already had laws on the books against disturbing church services. **Another, new law wasn't needed.**

But a grandstanding politician sponsored this bill, targeting life advocates, **who were seeking to end abortion** by peacefully sharing their right-to-life message on a public sidewalk outside of his church. He created a new felony offense criminalizing those who distribute flyers and tracts at church.

Molly Jenkins sets a high bar before supporting new criminal laws, especially those with unknown consequences and this bill would enable the prosecution of pro-life advocates; Christians who are opposing the construction of the new mosques that are targeting Oklahoma; and those who are attempting to be a witness to Muslims and others by handing out tracts.

She values the history of Christian evangelism, and she casts her votes thoughtfully — never impulsively. New proposals should stand the test of scrutiny before being rushed into law. **She votes "no" on many proposals** — making her one of the most independent voices in the House.

This is likely one of many out-of-context attacks to come against Jenkins. Anonymous dark-money groups rely on secrecy, confusion, and distortion because they cannot defend their record in the open.

They often attack the few grassroots legislators who, like Molly, are presumed to not have enough lobbyist-donated money to defend themselves and ability to explain the whole context of the issue. But they have underestimated Molly.

She is a fighter, and just as she fights for our values and those who live here, she is also going to fight to let the truth be known.

If you believe House District 33 deserves independent leadership — not representation bought and paid for by special interests — **stand with Molly Jenkins on June 16th.**
