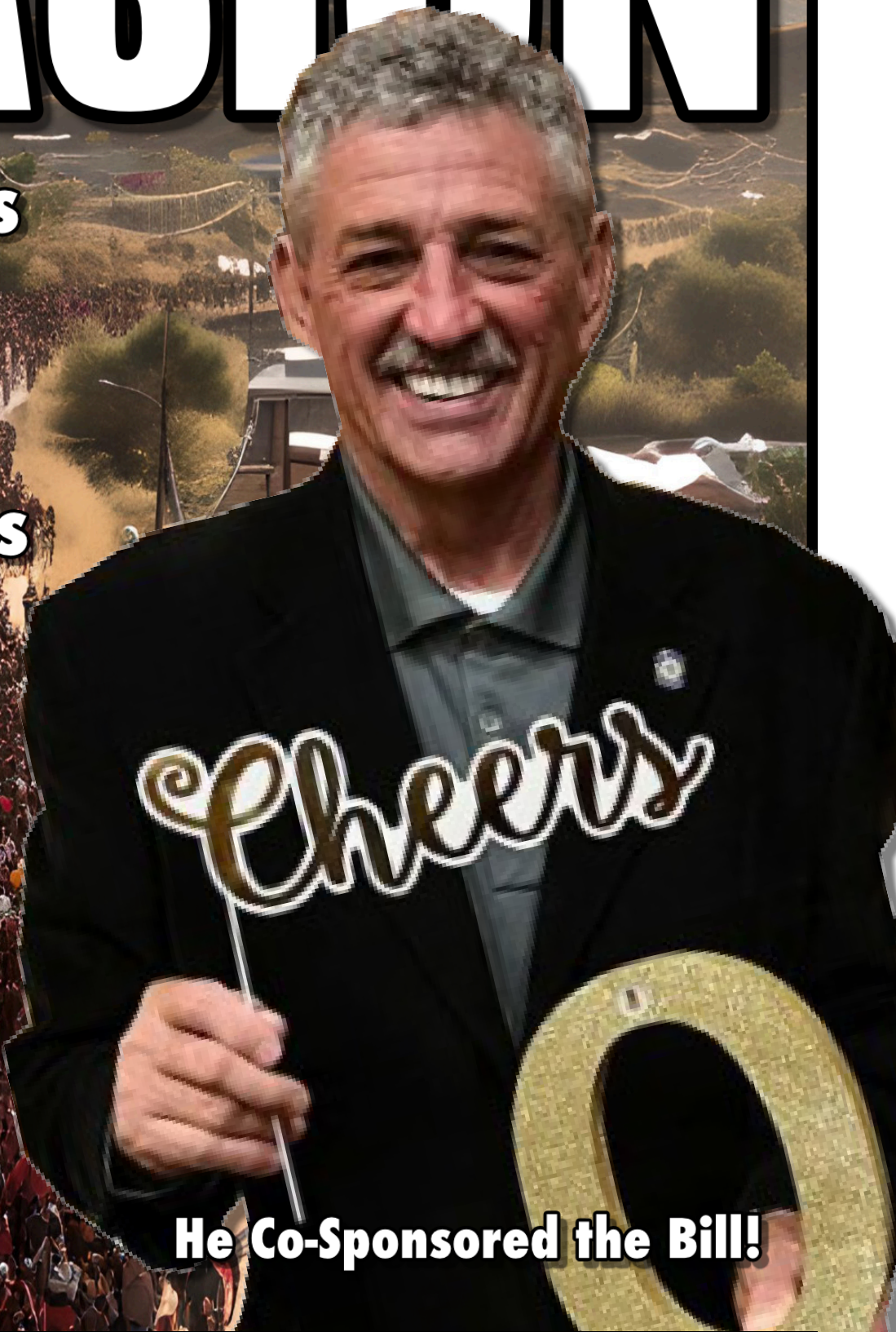

OKLAHOMA'S LICENSE TO CHAOS: JOHN TALLEY'S DRIVE TO GIVE ILLEGALS THE GREEN LIGHT SPARKS FURY

Our State Representative, John Talley, is not shying away from controversy. Even while trying to market himself as a "conservative" while in the district, in Oklahoma City, he is co-sponsoring one of the Legislature's most disputed bills: driver's licenses for illegal aliens. After the primary author of the bill was charged with a felony, Talley remains the only Republican author of the proposal. Molly Jenkins says Talley's liberalism is betraying the local voters and she wants to bring an end to Talley's six-year reign of absurd liberalism. She wants the voters to replace John Talley with their vote for her on June 18th.

In a jaw-dropping spree of legislative audacity, Oklahoma lawmakers are on a roll, pushing the envelope with bills that sound more like political and corruption thrillers than public policy.

For example, the Legislature, seemingly on a mission to redefine 'controversial,' has green-lit a dystopian track-and-tax scheme.

Every mile you drive, they'll be watching—and billing. And if that wasn't enough, welcome to the new age of "green" corporate welfare on steroids, an avalanche of hundreds of millions of dollars that are being repeatedly approved by John Talley and his legislative counterparts in green technology giveaways to woke corporations.

But, perhaps most controversial of all, at the heart of the storm is HB 2114, a bill that's sparking flames of controversy across the Sooner State Capitol crowd. Co-sponsored by the brazen John Talley, who campaigns as a "conservative" back in the district, this piece of legislation is set to hand over Oklahoma driver's licenses to illegal aliens, flipping traditional Republican values on their head and making a complete mockery of the long-held American tradition of upholding the consistent application of the rule of law for all.

District 33 Voters to Decide

House District 33 voters are set to decide on this issue; it's at the heart of the campaign launched by Molly Jenkins, the retired Real Estate Broker who is taking time away from her small cow-calf operation to

challenge Talley and give the voters the ability to end his repeated support of what she calls indefensible proposals.

Rewarding the Illegal Invaders of America

The illegal alien driver's license proposal has haunted the legislature over the course of the last two sessions.

It was first proposed by a liberal Democrat Senator and immigration attorney. A coalition of liberal Republicans and Democrats won approval on the Senate floor.

Then, after the immigration attorney's bill failed to receive consideration in the House, John Talley and fellow Republican Ryan Martinez joined with three liberal Democrats to sponsor and co-sponsor their own version of the controversial proposal. That bill was approved in committee and currently awaits consideration on the House floor.

But in a strange twist, Martinez was charged with a felony.

A wobbly Ryan Martinez, a high-ranking member of House leadership, seeks to strike a balance during an October of 2022 sobriety test. Two months later, Martinez was charged with Actual Physical Control Of Vehicle While Intoxicated. A few weeks after that, even though Martinez was facing a felony charge, John Talley joined with Martinez in sponsoring Martinez's bill to give Oklahoma driver's licenses to illegal aliens. Since that time Martinez reached a deal with prosecutors and subsequently resigned thus leaving Talley as the sole Republican author of the bill.

Now, Talley remains the only Republican co-sponsor of the legislation. In fact, Talley's name is the only Republican name on the bill.

The Implications: The Election System

The legislation has been heavily supported by leftist activists and sought after by various lobbyist-represented groups, at least one of which is one of Talley's donor groups.

These groups advocate for the proposal because it will allow them to hire illegal aliens and, in the course of the employment, use those illegals as drivers on Oklahoma roads.

However, its implications extend far beyond hiring illegals.

Section Three of the bill actually requires the State Election Board to purge evidence of investigations into illegals who may be using the license to register to vote.

This destruction of documents would likely make citizen efforts to investigate illegals trying to sign up as voters much more difficult.

This concern recently became even more heightened after state election board officials conducted a purge on some of the conscientious local-level board members.

Those members were attempting to ask questions and observe the absentee ballot counting process in Oklahoma County.

They had reportedly been forced to watch through a closed-circuit television system, a shocking requirement especially considering the lopsided differential between that county's mail-in votes, and its election day votes.

If the Oklahoma County election board members can't see the no-excuse, absentee ballot counting in person, then how can the average member of the public expect even a minimum level of transparency?

The state election board not only removed the local board members from their job but shockingly, referred them for possible criminal prosecution, a frightening turn of events that sends a message to anyone who dares bring conscientious, citizen oversight to the election system and certainly one that puts the document destruction mandate of Talley's bill into

frightening perspective.

There's another concerning implication: the potential for giving access to the banking system to the cartels via illegal aliens who have managed to get the Oklahoma driver's licenses.

These licenses are potential tools for opening bank accounts and once illegals have banking access, that access is likely to be abused by the cartels, fentanyl distributors, and human smugglers who are thriving because of the illegal immigration problem.

Oklahoma is already under siege from illegal aliens from China. These illegals are being smuggled into the country as slave laborers for the state's many marijuana grows. Legislation such as this will potentially put any number of these slave labor operators into the banking sector with all of the potential money laundering and similar implications.

Already a destination point for the illegal Chinese, once word about Talley's bill gets out to the coyotes and other smugglers, Oklahoma is likely to become a welcome center for illegal gangs of all nationalities such as the illegal gangs from Venezuela and other criminals who are likely being released from jails in their home countries and sent to America.

There's another concern with Talley's proposal: it potentially devalues Oklahoma licenses when traveling to other states.

Florida announced that it will not honor out-of-state drivers licenses issued to illegals and even put criminal penalties on those who try to use them. This potentially puts Oklahomans through additional scrutiny and embarrassment when they drive in Florida on an Oklahoma license and Florida law enforcement has to closely examine the Oklahoma license to ascertain if the licensee is an illegal alien who is subject to prison time.

John Talley illustrated this by debating and voting against the most important self-defense proposal in the modern history of the state.

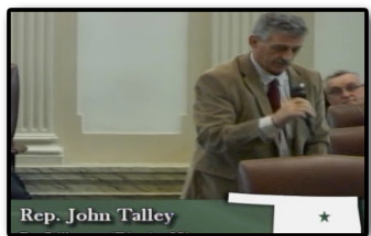

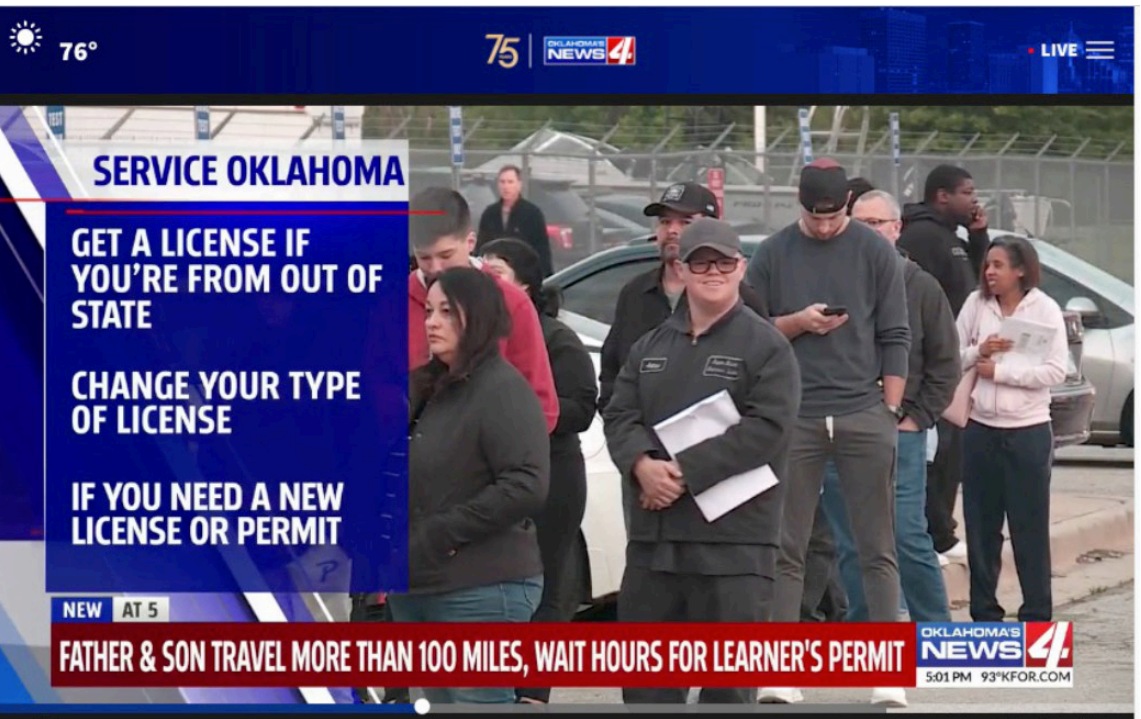
Molly Jenkins expresses a harsh critique of the politicians and cartels responsible for this crisis.

July of 2023, from News 4: Oklahomans in long lines as they try to follow the law and receive driver's license-related services from Service Oklahoma. Already hampered by the dangerous federal 'Real ID' requirements and biometrics data collection, the state's processing for licensing services has greatly struggled over the past few years to provide adequate service levels.

Now, John Talley's co-sponsored legislation aims to green-light as many as 33,000 more applicants—many of whom will be illegal aliens.

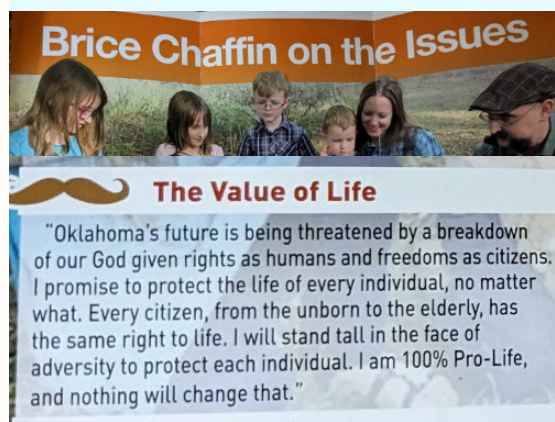
Notwithstanding the fact that the dirty money group dropped thousands of dollars in the last few days of the election, Talley only won by a thin margin of just 205 votes.

We Have Seen This Before

This has been the new method of campaigning by the liberal, special-interests-funded, uni-party in Oklahoma City. It's a template that first appeared when Joy Hofmeister took over the education department just over 10 years ago.

Court documents showed that Hofmeister had knowledge of and depended on dark money groups to attack her opponent; this allowed Hofmeister to run a positive, "Joyful," campaign whilst all along knowing her dark money allies would take care of the nasty politics.

In this case, John Talley takes in many thousands of dollars from a



who's who of special interest groups, unions, and the alpha politicians who seek to control the House of Representatives by funneling money to their yes-men underlings, including Talley.

This money is used to fill the voters' mailboxes with positive pieces featuring a smiling Talley and touting his "conservatism."

This is quite deceptive as *The Oklahoma Constitution*, Oklahoma's gold standard for grading legislators, ranks Talley as one of the most liberal Republicans in the Legislature, and their last index graded him at just 33% conservative.

The reader can navigate to page seven of this publication to see a comprehensive detailing of Talley's many liberal votes, from just the last session alone.

Then, if Talley's "positive" campaign isn't enough, and polling shows that Talley is still at risk, the dark money forces are unleashed.

They do whatever they can to destroy Talley's opponent and ensure that their voice in the Legislature is returned to office.

YOU ARE THE JURY: ELECTION INTEGRITY ON TRIAL ON JUNE 18TH.

As the 2020 election approached, Democrat-aligned groups across the nation sought to eliminate mail-in absentee ballot safeguards, such as signature matching and notarizations.

In Oklahoma, these groups successfully convinced the Oklahoma Supreme Court to eliminate the state's absentee ballot notarization requirement.

Oklahoma's Election Secretary stated, "this decision effectively leaves Oklahoma without a means to verify that the person who signs an absentee ballot affidavit is the same person to whom the ballot was issued."

In response, legislation came to the House to restore part of this requirement.

Just two liberal House

Republicans joined with the Democrats to vote against the bill; **one of those liberal Republicans was our State Representative, John Talley.**

Despite Talley's opposition, the bill was signed and Oklahoma mostly avoided the chaos that discredited the 2020 election processes in numerous other states where Democrats successfully compromised election integrity safeguards.

However, had Talley been successful with his "No!" vote, Oklahoma's absentee ballots would have had no independent verification: no signature match check and no notarizations.

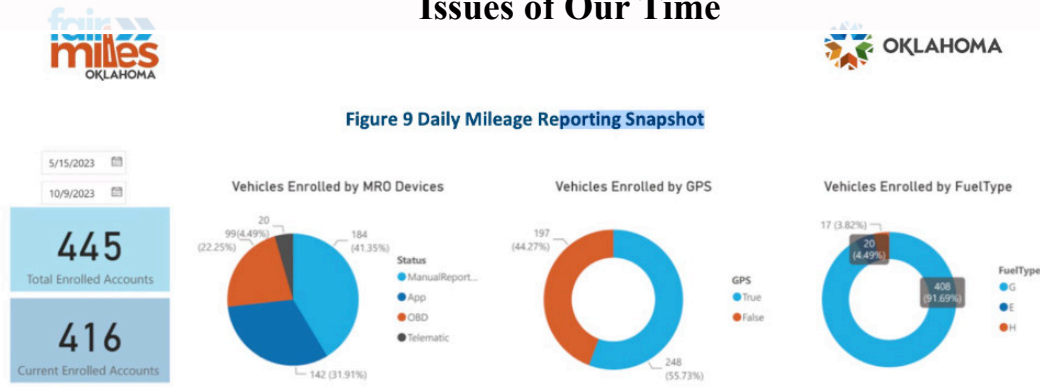
Jenkins knows this violation of our election standards was absolutely unfathomable. She believes Talley and the "justices" on the court must be held accountable by the voters.

She is encouraged by Texas Attorney General Ken Paxton's recent efforts to defeat old-guard justices in the Texas primary elections after those justices prevented his ability to prosecute voter fraud.

GASLIGHTING ON GAS

How John Talley Mised Payne County on One of The Most Important Issues of Our Time

In June of 2023, Molly Jenkins reached out to her State Representative John Talley to express her concern: A local candidate for County Commissioner had sent Jenkins a mailer. That mailer accused the Department of Transportation of setting up the first stage of the controversial track-and-tax pilot plan.

It will allow the government to track every mile that motorists drive and tax them by the mile.

It had been made possible because of a house bill that was supported by Talley.

Jenkins reached out to Talley, via email, and asked him about the plan. Talley incorrectly declared that the plan had nothing to do with combustion vehicles — only electric vehicles.

This statement, wasn't true. And, it wasn't the first time Talley had stated this incorrect fact.

During the 2022 elections, Talley had similarly misinformed a community meeting in Payne County.

At that meeting, Talley's challenger, Brice Chaffin, attempted to educate the audience on the dangers of the Talley-supported plan and correctly warned that it would potentially include all vehicles, not just electric cars; but Talley reportedly told the audience that Chaffin was wrong and the plan only applied to electric vehicles.

One of Chaffin's campaign volunteers artfully explained, "Everyone in the know on this issue knew that Talley was telling it wrong; but, it was

rather assumed that he was just comically out of touch, much to the detriment of the people of Payne County with whom he was speaking.

But, it's stunning to see in this email to you, over two years after the plan was approved and while the first stage was being literally implemented, Talley was still so very wrong on the details.

This is literally creating a government surveillance state where the government can potentially charge motorists more for each mile driven that's over an amount the government deems 'acceptable for the environment.'

In December of 2023, the state issued their official report on the program.

There, in black and white, the report clearly documented the state's intent to apply track-and-tax to combustion engine vehicles.

The report showed that, contrary to Talley's claims, 91% of the participating vehicles were gas-powered vehicles, not electric.

Worse, not only will track-and-tax apply to our combustion engine vehicles, but state bureaucrats want to take the implementation to the next level; however, they are waiting until after this election before moving forward with the next phase of track-and-tax.

If re-elected, Talley can again vote for the plan while not having to go back before the voters until the 2026 election cycle.

To this day, Jenkins is unaware of Talley ever correcting the record or coming clean with the fact that he has repeatedly misinformed the public, nor is

Here's the dynamic: Lobbyists use funds for lavish nights out at some of Oklahoma City's finest restaurants and entertainment venues.

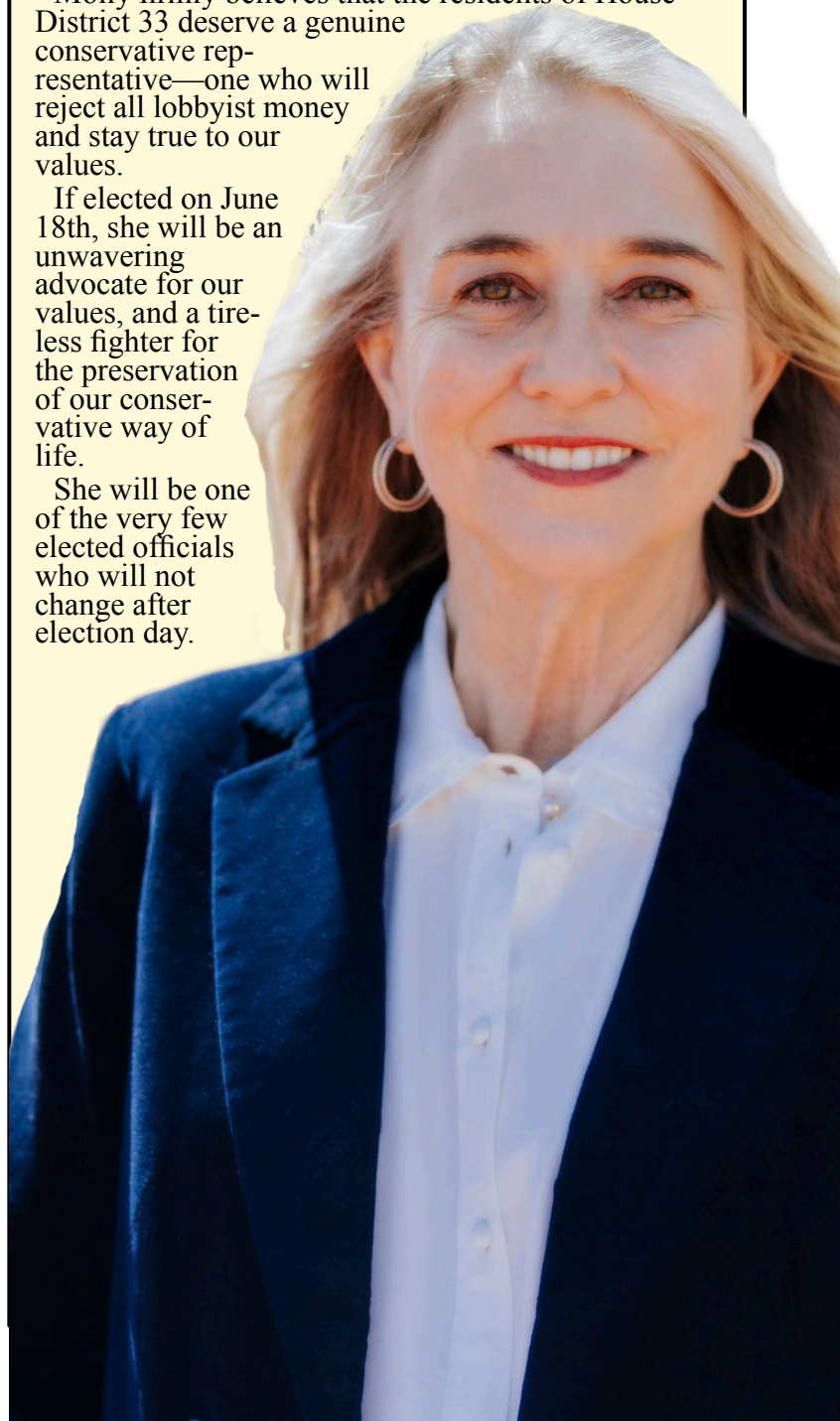

The year was 1978. A group of conservative Oklahoma Republicans were extremely frustrated because once again, liberal Democrats had defeated them in the 1978 midterm elections.

Those Republicans knew that the Democrats were liberals, but they felt the Democrats were deceiving the voters and tricking the voters into thinking that they were, in fact, not liberals. This was deception!

Those Republicans decided that they needed to do something about it.

Their solution?

They created what would become Oklahoma's gold standard for holding Oklahoma politicians accountable for their votes. Known as *The Oklahoma Conservative Index*, the system has graded every Oklahoma legislator ever since. Now, years later, much has changed.

No longer is it the Democrats who are pretending to be conservative.

Now, it's the Republicans!

Alarming, in the past few years, the index has

tracked Republicans as they have moved dramatically leftward, led by John Talley, our state representative who has regularly ranked as one of the most liberal Republicans.

In 2023, the Index showed Talley voting just 33 percent conservative, basically, he's voting conservative just 1/3 of the time.

His lifetime score on the index now ranks just 47, meaning he's now officially been more liberal than conservative.

Upon releasing this year's index, one of the editors of the Constitution, published an editorial entitled "*Republican In Name Only (RINO)*."

In that editorial, Ron McWhirter explained that "*viewed as a whole, the Oklahoma Legislature is now more liberal than it is conservative. Prior to this year, the opposite was true.*"

Indeed, over the last several years, the Legislature has been drifting steadily leftward," and, "the rapidly growing prob-

lem in the Legislature is the Republican In Name Only (RINO) members of the majority party.

They make up a significant, and growing, segment of the Republicans in the Legislature.

In the past, these moderate Republicans would probably have been registered Democrats.

Today, they masquerade as Republicans because they could not get elected otherwise."

Molly Jenkins shares this view.

She feels that liberals like John Talley are deceiving and taking advantage of Republican voters. In the spirit of truth in advertising, she thinks Talley should be running as a Democrat, not a Republican.

"What makes this especially offensive is the deceptive nature of this game.

No one would blame Talley if he simply embraced his liberalism, and changed parties then moved to Oklahoma City or Tulsa and ran for the legislature there; but instead,

he's marketing himself as a 'conservative' and he's trying to represent those of us in the rural areas who really care about conservative values, but in fact, he keeps frequently voting as a liberal.

This is in my view reprehensible.

I think he's taking advantage of us and we can't allow this deception to continue."

The Oklahoma Conservative Index is online at OklahomaConstitution.com.

After last year's legislative session, a group of Republican grassroots leaders, led by the Oklahoma Republican Party Vice-Chairman, came together to conduct a comprehensive audit of the Legislature's votes in that session.

These grassroots activists strongly suspected that many of our legislators are deceiving us.

They campaign as conservatives, but once elected, they come under the influence of special interests and government and govern as liberals.

The group sought to answer the following question:

Are Republican legislators voting in accordance with the Republican Platform?

They reviewed the votes and found approximately 100 instances where the right vote, according to the Republican Platform, was clear.

Each lawmaker was assigned a point if they voted in accordance with the Platform.

lowing shocking fact: Our state representative, John Talley, votes for Republican values 29.57% of the time!

From the creation of new state agencies to the endorsement of expansive programs, Talley's 2023 votes consistently favored a beefier government apparatus.

A less efficient, more expensive government that's out of touch with the needs of its citizens.

In the midst of economic turmoil, Talley's priorities are clear: more for the government, political and corporate class.

Keep in mind, these votes are almost exclusively from the 2023 legislative session and due to the constraints of space, there are many other bad votes from 2023 and John Talley's other numerous sessions in the Legislature that could not be listed here.

But, this sampling of votes is given in order to disprove a narrative that Talley seems desperate to

Sampling of votes from 2023 legislative session shows John Talley is still casting many liberal votes.

Pay Raises for Government Officials

HB 2860: Creates a large pay raise for statewide elected officials. This bill serves as a striking example of the astonishingly tone-deaf nature of this year's legislative session and Republican legislative leaders at large. In the midst of rampant Bidenflation, which is mercilessly squeezing the wallets of hardworking taxpayers, Talley and the Legislature has the audacity to push for substantial pay raises for statewide officials. With a fiscal impact of nearly a half million per year, it's simply inexcusable.

SB 28X: 48 million dollars to Higher-Ed for faculty pay raises. As many Oklahoma Higher-Ed institutions continue to destroy our future generations with the toxic poison of DEI, Talley has seen to it that they will be compensated richly—and we will all pay for it.

Millions in Taxpayer Subsidies to The Oklahoma City Thunder

SB 604 and SB 13X: Not once, but twice, Talley voted to extend the state's massive, multi-million dollar subsidy to the NBA's Thunder organization.

While receiving this corporate welfare, the value of the Thunder organization has increased massively. Forbes reports the value of the Thunder now exceeds three billion dollars; when legislators first approved the subsidy, it was worth less than one billion dollars. That notwithstanding, Talley green-lit yet another 15 years' worth of subsidies, millions of dollars, to be taken from taxpayers and given to the wealthy owners of this team.

Corporate Welfare on Steroids: Talley Signs Off on the Mega-Multi Million Dollar Giveaways To Woke, Green Technology Companies

Back in 2022, Talley voted for HB 4455: it's believed to be the largest corporate welfare giveaway in state history. Talley's program allocated a staggering \$698 million to an "unnamed" corporation. Reporters revealed that this giveaway was intended for the multinational, woke Panasonic corporation to build a green technology factory in Pryor.

Especially alarming, its contents were made public at 2:28 PM on April 18th, and Talley and the House gave final approval the following morning at 11:43 AM.

This represented an unconscionable breach of public trust, making a mockery of the Constitution's requirement for three public readings on three separate days.

Worse still, this bill seemed to open the floodgates for the new era of woke corporate welfare on steroids.

In 2023, Talley doubled down by voting for House Bill 1038, adding another \$145 million to the Panasonic giveaway in a shucked bill that had less than a day of transparency.

He voted for SB 1177 and SB 1179, allocating \$180 million to Enel North America, another 'woke', DEI-touting corporation from Massachusetts; this time to put a green manufacturing plant in Inola.

Once again, history repeated itself as the Legislature rushed the bill, providing only a few days of transparency before its final passage.

SB 677: Talley Doesn't Think You Deserve to Know the Address of Those Who Want Your Vote

This bill prohibits the public from knowing the address listed by a legislative candidate on his declaration of candidacy form. It's yet another arrogant move by an elite class of politicians who seem to think they can keep their addresses secret from those they are trying to represent.

Talley's Sunset Law Evasion: Abdicating His Responsibility To Conduct Oversight and Ensure Accountability

Talley voted for HB 2556, to completely exempt the state's important Construction Industries Board from the state's critical Sunset Law. Sunset Laws are vital as they require the Legislature to reassess an agency's existence periodically; without renewal, an agency ceases to exist, ensuring bureaucratic accountability. However, Talley and the Board circumvented this accountability by removing the board from the law's scope. This bill only passed the House by two votes. Had Talley and one other representative changed their vote, it would have been defeated.

Bending Rules for Higher Education: Talley's Vote Exempts Higher Education from Cost-Cutting Law

Talley voted for SB 316, exempting Oklahoma's Higher Education institutions from having to follow the Oklahoma State Government Asset Reduction and Cost Savings Program law. This vital law seeks to prevent the government from buying and owning land that it does not need. There's simply no justification for giving Higher Ed a pass. Capitol insiders know the truth: Higher Ed carries a lot of influence in the Legislature and allows them to get special treatment like this.

Ignoring Reagan's Warning: Talley Backs Creation of New, Massive State Bureaucracy

In the past, legislative Republicans ardently worked to reduce state government bureaucracies. However, this commitment seems to have faded with legislators like Talley, who clearly lack a definitive strategy to downsize the administrative state.

In 2023, Talley backed SB 622, establishing a new bureaucratic entity, Service Oklahoma, as an independent agency rather than maintaining it within the state's central services agency.

This move signifies yet another layer added to the state government's bureaucratic structure.

Talley would have done well to pay attention to the wisdom of President Reagan who said: "Government programs, once launched, never disappear. Actually, a government bureau is the nearest thing to eternal life we'll ever see on this earth."

Talley's votes for new government entities extend beyond SB 622. His 2023 supported initiatives include forming the 25-person SemiQuicentennial Commission (HB 1776), estimated to cost \$1.2 million, and the Floor Drought Management Task Force (HB 2293), lacking a sunset date and with functions overlapping existing entities.

Spending Our Money Like Never Before: Talley Votes for the Largest General Appropriations Bill in State History

In 2023, Talley supported House Bill 1004X, the largest general appropriations bill with an eye-popping 31.09% increase in spending. Talley has voted for every general appropriations bill since his election.

In those five years, those bills have increased spending from \$8.1 billion to \$12.9 billion; in other words, in his time in office, Talley has grown legislative spending by 58.67%.

Other multi-million dollar new spending programs Talley signed off on in 2023 include:

HB 1030X: A government program to "leverage private capital" for startups.

This type of government-controlled investment in the private sector is picking the winners and losers of the free market and creates a completely inappropriate, state-managed econ-

omy.

It would be funded by 13.75 million dollars of our taxpayer dollars from the GA bill.

HB 1031X: A new government program for channeling massive funds to low-to-no interest homebuilding loans.

As average Oklahomans struggle with Bidenflation, this bill aims to dump another 109 million dollars of taxpayer funds into a government-managed spending program with all of the inherent consequences and inefficiencies of a government-led spending effort.

HB 1376: For the next two years, expand eligibility for free school meals up to 250% of the poverty level.

HB 2014: Expand +1 year Medicaid pregnancy coverage up to 205% of the poverty level. This would have had a fiscal impact of multiple millions.

HB 2941: Dumps another 10 million dollars into the Art Council's account, to "address the negative economic impacts of the pandemic."

It's a case-in-point demonstration of how government has abused the COVID spending for things that are clearly not health policy-related.

SB 31X: 18 million dollars to the Pop Culture Museum in Tulsa. Another example of how Talley makes us all pay for a targeted earmark that's likely some group or politician's pet project.

Even More Fee Increases: Talley Says 'Yes!'

In a year when state government increased allocations by more than 30%, not one of these increases were necessary. Government had plenty of money to somehow cover any needed expense.

That notwithstanding, examples of Talley's 2023 fee increase and new tax request authorization votes include:

HB 1590: This creates a 66% increase in the 911 fee increase paid by cell phone users. The fee had already been increased as recently as 2017.

One estimate suggests the total cost of the newest increase could be 30 million dollars per year on the taxpayers as they attempt to pay their cellphone bills; it even applies new fees to landline phones.

In a year when the State Legislature increased state spending by so much, it's hard to imagine that they would also increase our cell phone's 911 fee by 66%. This is the perfect case-in-point for illustrating the uncontrollable greed of government.

Ironically, the fee increase could have an unintended effect. State government owns many cell phones.

For example, the Department of Public Safety has 2,010 cell phones. The Department will have to pay \$12,060.00 in new fees—to the government. This is the type of absurdity that's occurring in Talley's wacky world of increased fees and uncontrolled spending.

HB 2173: The state currently assesses a fee on every 100 pounds of raw Grade A milk produced in Oklahoma. This bill directed the Department of Agriculture to double that fee. Fortunately, as of the time of this publication, it hasn't been approved by the Senate.

HB 2141: This bill attempted to increase 30 different fees on the barbering and cosmetology industry.

After Talley and the House approved it, it was exposed in the Senate where it was overwhelmingly defeated, only receiving the votes of 12 Senators.

Surveillance State Creep Accelerates

ORWELL'S 1984 LOOMS OVER OKLAHOMA

Molly Jenkins says the Oklahoma Legislature now regularly considers proposals to advance the Orwellian surveillance state and many legislators have yet to understand the importance of and impact of their votes. She says John Talley is one of those who have been voting for these proposals.

Over recent years, the Oklahoma Legislature, known for its Republican majority, has been considering and even approving a series of alarming surveillance state bills.

Recent examples include the Orwellian track-and-tax plan highlighted on this page; a dangerous centralization of our medical records—SBs 1369 and 574, both supported by John Talley—which has far-reaching implications from hacking to blackmail;

a proposal by the powerful House Speaker that appears to pave the way for the U.S. FedCoin, which has already passed the House Rules Committee;

and a currently pending legislative proposal to authorize a frightening, real-time, statewide, 24-7 vehicle tracking system, feared to be accessible to the federal government, with pieces of this system already in place in the

Guthrie area, even though the legislation has not yet been approved.

Contrary to what many might expect in "red" Oklahoma, the state's legislators have shown a high degree of vulnerability to financial and special interest influences.

This vulnerability renders these legislators prime targets nationally.

If surveillance state advocates succeed in swaying policy in Oklahoma using their financial clout, they can leverage this success as a precedent in other states, arguing, "Since 'red' Oklahoma has adopted these measures, it's reasonable to implement them here too."

This scenario places us at the epicenter of a critical battle to safeguard our nation.

The only viable remedy to this threat is to elect representatives who

1. clearly understand the risks involved, and
2. steadfastly refuse to take

money from lobbyists or their employers, thus shielding themselves from the sway of the special interests who have proven so skilled at ruining our legislators.

The contrast in House District 33 couldn't be more evident: John Talley has already gone on the record in support of the dangerous track and tax initiative that threatens to put the government in charge of tracking every mile that you drive, and he has repeatedly misinformed the public about the scope and scale of the proposal.

Talley has also voted for the centralization of our medical records under the control of the government.

In stark contrast, Molly Jenkins pledges to reject such funds and to oppose the expansion of the surveillance state.

In these perilous times for our freedoms, taking chances is not an option.

We must break away from the current path to 1984.

This June 18th presents an opportunity for decisive change, and it is imperative that we seize it.

Oklahoma's controversial track-and-tax program is on the ballot on June 18th, John Talley has voted to support it, Molly Jenkins will fight it.

In 2021, with John Talley's vote, the Oklahoma Legislature established a new government task force.

That task force was authorized to develop a pilot program to track and tax drivers for each mile traversed on Oklahoma roads.

This initiative is being funded by the federal government in Oklahoma and other states.

It proposes a variety of intrusive Orwellian tracking technologies to monitor motorists and then bill them for miles traveled.

Readers of the proposal, who were smart and alert to its implications, could immediately grasp the terrifying prospects it unveiled.

Those who remember former President Reagan's words, "The nearest thing to eternal life we will ever see on this earth is a government program," knew that once Talley voted to create this program, it would be very difficult to ever stop it.

One can now easily imagine the not-too-distant future when government trackers determine that you are driving too much and need to pay a higher per-mile tax if you wish to continue driving because you are "hurting the environment."

And those in the know could look to the State of Oregon, where they created a similar pilot initiative but have since started advancing legis-

lation to make participation in the program mandatory.

In New York City, the tracking scanners have just been installed, and there, city officials are planning to charge a \$15 daily fee for each car that enters the city, a tax on poor people who need to drive to work but can't afford to live in the city.

Back in Oklahoma, after Talley voted to open Pandora's box, the new task force took to the work of hiring a woke, out-of-state firm to conduct the first phase of the program.

As expected, their final report contained glowing descriptions about the possibilities of the track-and-tax and encouraged the state to take the program to the next stage: voluntary participation by the general population which is an obvious intermediate step on the dangerous path to mandatory participation.

But here's the tricky part: they are waiting until after the election before sponsoring the legislation, which means that if Talley is re-elected, he can again vote for the program and hope that the voters forget before another election rolls around.

If Jenkins defeats Talley, it will be seen as a voter rejection of track-and-tax.

Other legislators may see this as a turning of the tide and upon seeing Talley's defeat, they are likely to flip-flop.

This will place Jenkins in a powerful position to debate against and defeat the proposal when it comes back before the Legislature in 2025.

The Timeline of Track-and-Tax: Ever since John Talley gave the green light, the feds and the state have been busy moving forward with track-and-tax plan.

MARCH 26, 2021: Fox News host Laura Ingraham tweets her response to comments from Biden Transportation Secretary Pete Buttigieg's CNBC interview. In that interview, Buttigieg stated that a new "miles traveled" tax "shows a lot of promise."

In her response, Ingraham points out how this tax will hurt the poor and middle class.

APRIL 27, 2021: John Talley and The Oklahoma House of Representatives give their approval to HB 1712.

The bill creates a new state government entity called the Road User Charge Task Force and authorizes it to enact Oklahoma's pilot program for collecting travel data and charging motorists a tax for every mile traveled.

NOVEMBER 15, 2021: Joe Biden signs his \$1.2 trillion infrastructure plan. Section 13002 of the plan sets aside federal funding for the new tax-by-the-mile program and gives Buttigieg authority to establish a per-mile fee.

SUMMER 2022: At a House

District 33 forum, Brice Chaffin attempts to warn the public of the dangers of the Talley plan.

Talley dismisses Chaffin's concerns by incorrectly stating that the plan only applies to electric vehicles. State records show that Chaffin was correct and Talley had misled the voters.

Just before Election Day, thousands of dollars of dark money attacked Chaffin and Talley won the election by a slight margin.

JUNE 7, 2022: A State of Oregon legislative committee approves making Oregon's version of their track-and-tax plan mandatory.

Like Oklahoma, Oregon's version of track-and-tax originally started out as a pilot program.

JANUARY 2023: The federal government has approved 1.9 million dollars for the Oklahoma program.

Oklahoma is just one of several states to receive money from the federal government to work on imple-

mentation of the plan.

DECEMBER 14, 2023: The Oklahoma Task Force officially concludes the pilot program and calls on the Legislature to take the Oklahoma program to the next level but wants to wait until 2025, after the elections are over.

A close examination of the committee's documents reveals a "Social Equity and Fairness" section.

It suggests the miles tax could lead to "more efficient behavior and an increase in social welfare."

This hints at the dangerous mindset of the bureaucrats behind this program and how they might abuse the tax to seek certain Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) outcomes.

It also says the program can account for "negative externalities" such as "accidents, noise and emissions" introducing the possibility that motorists might pay different rates for different types of cars. Drive a gas-powered pickup? Pay more!
